

Surgery at Paws

Patients undergoing anesthesia here are cared for with the highest level of safety precautions, just like it's practiced in human medicine. All patients receive:

- The safest and most anesthetic agents and painkillers
- Close monitoring by five different advanced monitors: heart waves (ECG), oxygen level, pulse, blood pressure, and an esophageal stethoscope
- Intravenous catheter prior to surgery, so they can receive warm fluids while anesthetized
- Peace of mind from waking up snuggled in the arms of one of our nurses after surgery

Dentals include a thorough oral exam, anesthesia, and ultrasonic cleaning and teeth polishing. If there are painful, infected teeth that are beyond repair, extractions may be necessary.

Spays & Neuters include sterile gown, gloves, and surgical pack. Patients include a comprehensive pain management plan to include the best pain medications, administered before, during, and after, as well as additional pain medications to take home.

Canine Neuters & Canine & Feline Spays include radiosurgery, which is a cutting-edge technology used in place of a surgical blade. Radiosurgery coagulates vessels and lymphatics as it cuts, which decreases pain and speeds up healing.



Additional Options

Microchip Implantation is permanent identification which we recommend for all pets. The small chip is inserted under the skin, between your pet's shoulder blades. If he or she ever goes missing, the microchip can be scanned for your contact information, so your pet can find his or her way home safely. Microchips save lives!

Radiosurgery is cutting-edge technology, similar to laser surgery. The radiosurgery probe seals the blood vessels and lymphatic tissue as it cuts, resulting in less bleeding, less inflammation, less pain, and a quicker recovery. Radiosurgery is included in all spay prices, and is optional for most other surgeries.

OraVet Plaque Prevention Gel is applied along the gum line to slow down the formation of tartar. Some breeds and individuals have worse dental genetics than others, and the end of the dental is the perfect time to start OraVet.

Soft Paws are a fun and humane alternative to declawing indoor cats. These soft caps are glued directly onto trimmed nails, and typically last 4-6 weeks.

Pre & Post-Surgery

Pre-Anesthetic Bloodwork is required for patients seven years of age or older, but encouraged for all patients. We recommend more comprehensive send-off bloodwork for our geriatric patients prior to the day of anesthesia. Our veterinarians can recommend which panel is ideal for your pet.

Post-Surgery Sedation is recommended if your pet has "happy pants" on most of the time! "Doggie downers" help relax your pet after surgery, to facilitate quick healing, help make bedrest possible, and help prevent self-induced setbacks. Having a calm post-op "patient" to care for is easier for pet parents, too!

E-Collars are a great idea for most patients, to prevent pets from removing their own stitches! We offer both soft and hard-frame E-collar options.

Laser Therapy-done post surgery, promotes quicker healing by reducing inflammation, accelerating tissue repair, and reducing pain through photo-bio-modulation.
